

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





The Region's Growth Has Increased Productivity and Wages












The Share of Greater Portland's Population with Jobs Has Declined for Most Groups







Employment Trends Have Contributed to Uneven Income Gains



Young People Are Earning Less than Before





Share of U.S. Jobs at Risk of Automation



Share of Global Growth Occurring Outside the U.S.


